The Bachelor of Arts in Musical Theatre prepares students for professional careers by providing training in three essential elements of musical theatre: music, acting and dance. In addition to multiple performance opportunities, students study the history and literature of musical theatre.

To earn a Bachelor of Arts degree in Musical Theatre students must complete the following:

Musical Theatre Requirements and Expectations:

A student pursuing a major in Musical Theatre must meet the following criteria each semester:

- * satisfactory completion of all degree requirements as outlined in this Bulletin;
- participation in all theatrical productions and activities, including auditions, production crews, work calls, and production strikes as assigned by faculty;
- enrollment in THEA 2285 Practicum and MUSI 0999 Music Seminar every semester;
- attendance at scheduled performing arts meetings, activities, and productions;
- theatrical/musical proficiency a grade of "C" or better in all Theatre Arts and Music courses
- a professional work ethic

A student who does not meet all the above criteria each semester may be placed on probation. After the probationary period, the student will be reevaluated by the Musical

Theatre faculty. If it is determined that the student has failed to meet the above criteria satisfactorily, then the student will be advised to choose another major.

MUTH 2100 - Dance for the Musical Stage

Introductory and Advanced jazz, tap, ballet & musical theatre dance including contemporary Musical Theatre (1950s, 60s, 70s, 80s and 90s) genres of Broadway. This course may be taken for 0 credit hours and may be repeated once.

MUTH 2101 - Dance for the Musical Stage

Introductory and Advanced jazz, tap, ballet & musical theatre dance including contemporary Musical Theatre (1950s, 60s, 70s, 80s and 90s) genres of Broadway. May be repeated for credit.

Grade Basis: L Credit hours: 1.0 Lecture hours: 1.0

MUTH 3200 - Musical Theatre Performance I

A study of musical theatre performance techniques including song and text analysis and practical performance experience in the preparation of a music theatre repertory for performance.

Grade Basis: AL Credit hours: 3.0 Lecture hours: 3.0

MUTH 3201 - Musical Theatre Performance II

A continuation of MUTH 3200 with focus on advanced musical theatre selections and performances.

Grade Basis: AL Credit hours: 3.0 Lecture hours: 3.0

MUTH 4352 - History of Musical Theatre I

Intense study of musical theatre genres, composers, lyricists, performers, directors and choreographers and their contributions to this musical form in America from 1750 to the present. Includes consideration of how musical theatre developed and reflected the cultural, social and political landscape of its time.
