#### TROUP COUNTY HISTORICAL SOCIETY



The Troup County Archives & Legacy Museum, which operates as part of the Troup County Historical Society, preserves and shares the history of West Central Georgia by caring for local records, artifacts, and photographs. Founded in 1972 by community members dedicated to protecting the region’s past, the organization now brings those stories to life through the Legacy Museum on Main, offering exhibits, programs, and events that connect our community to its history.

#### ATLANTA HISTORY CENTER



Atlanta History Center uses history to connect people, culture, and history to cultivate understanding of our shared history.

#### CARLOS MUSEUM, EMORY UNIVERSITY



Set in the heart of Emory’s Atlanta campus, the Michael C. Carlos Museum is a dynamic, interdisciplinary center for the study of art and culture, with collections from Africa; ancient Egypt, Nubia, and the Near East; ancient Greece and Rome; the Indigenous Americas; and South Asia; as well as American and European Works on Paper. Through our permanent collections, engaging

special exhibitions, and innovative programs for audiences of all ages, the Carlos Museum connects the past with the present and the campus with the community.

## UNITED STATES CIVIL WAR NAVAL MUSEUM



The National Civil War Naval Museum in Columbus, Georgia is where history comes alive along the scenic Chattahoochee River. There you can explore the remains of a Confederate warship, the *Jackson*, and delve into an impressive collection of artifacts and exhibits, including the USS *Hartford* replica and the recreated iconic turret of the USS *Monitor*. The main gallery showcases the largest array of Civil War Naval-related flags in the nation, alongside a captivating timeline that highlights significant naval events of the war. The museum hosts a range of events throughout the year with living history interpretation, lectures, tours, cannon firings, weapons demonstrations, local history presentations and more.

### MY AMERICA ART PROJECT

#### LEWIS LIBRARY

MY AMERICA is a national, youth-driven art and civic engagement project that celebrates America's 250<sup>TH</sup> Anniversary. Students (K-12) from all 50 states and U.S. territories are invited to participate in a collective art project that reflects on the past and inspires the future. Each student will design a red, white, or blue 6" square fabric tile and together, these thousands of individual creations will form a giant American flag mosaic—roughly half the size a football field!

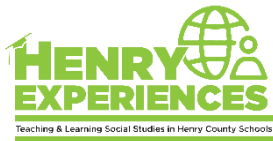

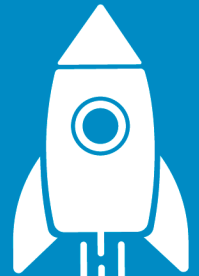

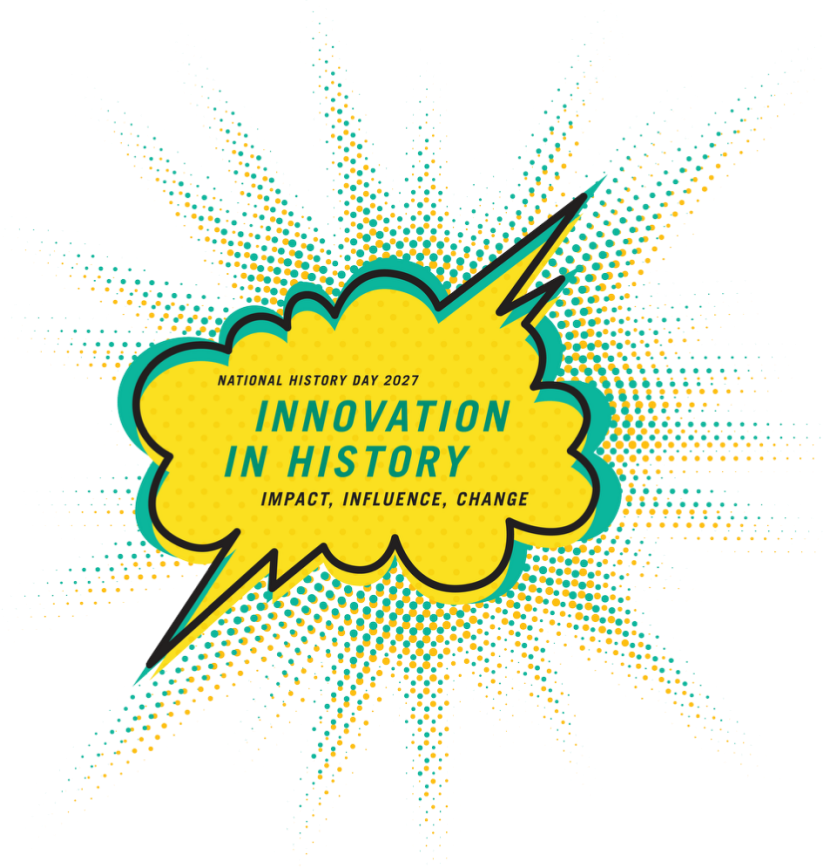
